Weil teaches art theory at the University of Maryland, College Park, where he also has directed the MFA colloquium and developed a curriculum on art, government and politics. He has taught in American University's MFA in Italy program, the MFA program at George Mason University and at the Corcoran College of Art and Design. He has received several DC Commission on the Arts and Humanities fellowships for his painting and sculpture and DC Commission grants for his art workshops for adults with intellectual disabilities. The artist was a founding member of the award winning Corcoran Artists Mentorship Program and later developed an innovative art and writing curriculum for at-risk high school students.
